Much admired were several contemporary paintings in new techniques and the Favourite item chosen by visitors is, well deserved, "Waggoners Wells Walk" by Exhibition Officer

The other paintings in the top 6 favourite are: Ronan Walsh, "Melita", Claudia Malitzki-Hastie "Early morning Frensham Pond", Jane Larkin "After the rain, Blackdown", Anna Austin "Windy Day at the Shimmerings" and Liz Crawford "Golden Explosion".

The Museum staff was very pleased to choose their favourite painting "The Whisper of Trees" by Yeside Linney for the Allan Thomson Award. They write: "This had interest both as a traditional work of art, but enhanced with the unusual (resin?) glossy finish...really interesting."
