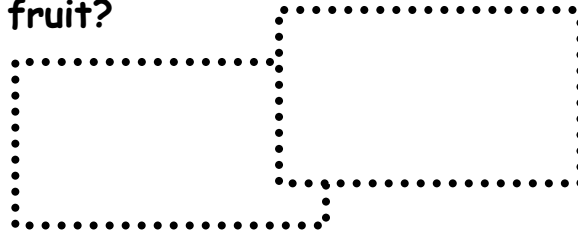

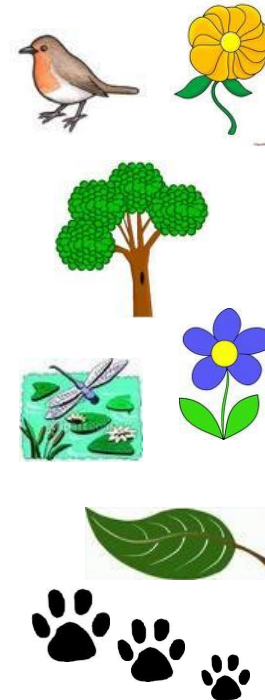
Habitats provide food, shelter and nesting sites for many insects, birds and mammals. Can you identify these wildlife characters by matching them up?

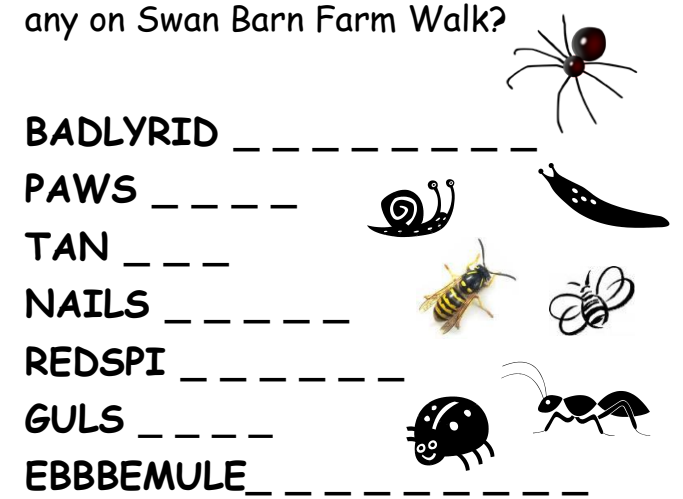
