

## TRAVEL INFORMATION

#### **BY ROAD**

There is good access via the A3 London-Portsmouth trunk road linking with the M25 at Junction 10. From London turn off the A3 at Milford and take the A286 direct to Haslemere. From Portsmouth, turn off at Liphook or at the Hindhead crossroads signposted Haslemere.

London is 44 miles and Portsmouth, 26 miles.
Channel Tunnel, Ebbsfleet, Ashford, Dover, Folkestone and Portsmouth all within 1 hour to 2 hours' drive.

#### **BY TRAIN**

Excellent train services operated by South West Trains provide regular direct services from London (Waterloo) to Portsmouth Harbour, stopping at Haslemere. Travel time from London is approximately 50 minutes and Portsmouth 45 minutes. 0845 7484950 (24 hr).

#### BY BUS

There are bus services from Guildford, Godalming, Aldershot, Farnham, Chichester and Bognor Regis, as well as local services round the town and neighbouring villages. Pick up a bus & rail timetable at the station, library or Haslemere Visitor Information Centre.

#### BY NATIONAL EXPRESS COACH

From London (Victoria) and Portsmouth. Phone National Express for details **0870 5808080**. Coach stop at Hindhead (1.7 miles from Haslemere). Local connection by bus or taxi (check connection details).

#### **BY AIR**

Heathrow **08700 000123**, Gatwick **08700 002468**, and Southampton **08700 400009** airports are about one hour's drive and can also be reached by train and coach. Stansted within 2 hours' drive.

#### **BY FERRY**

Regular services to and from France to Portsmouth (1 hour drive) and Dover (1½ to 2 hours drive)

#### WALKING

Guided town walks are available on selected Sundays from May-September. Walks start at 2.30pm and last approximately 1½-2 hours.

### HISTORIC BEGINNINGS

Haslemere is a town with very old foundations. Prehistoric hunters lived on Black Down and there were Celtic and Romano-British settlements in the 1st and 2nd centuries AD. The first known habitation was not recorded until AD 1180 when a chapel was built at Piperham, where the Parish Church of St. Bartholomew now stands.

A weekly market, confirmed by Charter in 1394 by Richard II, was held in front of the Town Hall where the High Street broadens, with rights being granted to hold an annual fair, now held biennially on what is referred to as Charter Fair Day. Elizabeth I laid the true foundations of the town by granting the right to elect two members of Parliament. In 1596 she confirmed the charter for a weekly market and increased the annual fairs to two.

In 1732 James E. Oglethorpe, an army General and MP for Haslemere, who lived at Town House, crossed the Atlantic and founded the Colony of Georgia, USA. Oglethorpe assisted many people in England who suffered under oppression to start a new life in the colony. The links with the city of

Haslemere High Street

Savannah, Georgia, remain to this day and in 1999 Haslemere's Town Mayor received the Freedom of Savannah.

The oldest part of Haslemere centres around the High Street where there are several buildings dating back to the 14th and 15th centuries. These include Half Moon House, opposite and south of the Town Hall; Tudor Cottage, adjoining the Georgian House Hotel; and the three-gabled building that is Lloyds Pharmacy. If you enter this shop and look up to the left, an old inscription dated 1613 can be seen engraved into a beam near the ceiling.

The main streets in the town are arranged in a T-shape with the High Street running south to north from the Town Hall which was built in 1814. Petworth Road, known as East Street in the 18th century, was originally called Cow Street as it was along this road that cattle were brought from farms in Sussex to be sold at the town market in the High Street. Similarly, Shepherds' Hill was so named because sheep from the Sussex Downs came to the market along this road. The third part of the "T" is completed by Lower Street. This led to the Pyle Well, one of the two main public sources of water in the town.

On the western edges of Haslemere there were flourishing tanneries where leather was prepared in the 18th century; this is now called Tanners Lane. The adjacent Town Meadow, on the corner of Lower Street, is a pleasant spot to relax. Across the road, a stone wall encloses the garden of the house where John Wornham Penfold lived. Mr Penfold was an architect who designed and altered a number of buildings around Haslemere during the latter part of the 19th century. He is remembered as the designer of the octagonal letter boxes introduced by the Post Office in 1866 - these were originally green in colour (letter boxes were not painted red until 1874) and there is a replica Penfold Box in the High Street under the old chestnut tree which was planted in 1792.

After the formation of the Surrey Constabulary in 1851, Haslemere became an outpost of Godalming with a resident force of two officers based at the Market House.

The most significant event to affect the development of the town was the opening, in 1859, of the railway connecting Haslemere with London, Guildford and Portsmouth. During the building of this railway Police Inspector William Donaldson of the Surrey Constabulary was killed outside the Town Hall whilst

controlling a group of railway construction workers who were attempting to release one of

their friends locked up in the Market House (now the Town Hall). An annual gathering of people meets at the Town Hall on the last Sunday in July to honour the memory of Inspector Donaldson.

Haslemere's first cottage hospital, built at the top of Shepherds' Hill in 1897, was a gift to the town from John Penfold and his sisters to mark the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Victoria. In 1922 the hospital in Church Lane was opened with two wards to replace the original cottage hospital, which had only six beds.

Change at first was quite slow with a number of large new houses being built nearby, more especially on the higher and drier heaths around Hindhead. A number of well known people settled in the area. Alfred Lord Tennyson, Poet Laureate to Queen Victoria, lived at his country retreat, Aldworth in Haslemere, until his death in 1892. He was known to walk from Aldworth to Grayswood where a small stream is said to be 'The Brook' of his poem of that name.

George Bernard Shaw wrote Caesar and Cleopatra when he lived at Hindhead and Sir Arthur Conan Doyle wrote some of his Sherlock Holmes stories

while living at Undershaw, built in 1897. George Eliot lived at Shottermill where she wrote Middlemarch.

Artists attracted to the area included Walter Tyndale, who lived in Hill Road, and Josiah Whymper (whose son Edward was the first person to climb the Matterhorn in 1865), who lived in Town House. Helen Allingham often painted in and around the town, although she lived at nearby Sandhills, Witley, from where she may have travelled on the new railway to sketch some of Haslemere's prettier tile-hung cottages.

While new development was taking place at the beginning of the 20th century, Haslemere played an important part in the Peasant Art Movement and the town became home to a number of craftsmen and women including spinners, silk weavers, furniture makers and metal workers. At Hammer Vale an art pottery was opened in 1901 by J. Radley-Young and Haslemere Ware was made there until 1911.

Haslemere has also enjoyed a long association with the Dolmetsch family arising from Arnold Dolmetsch, who was one of the key pioneers in presenting early music. Sir Yehudi Menuhin confirmed "He is the man no musician should ever forget". Indeed 2008 commemorated the 150th anniversary of Dolmetsch's birth with a celebration of his music.

### **OUT AND ABOUT**

Haslemere lies within the Surrey Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and has a fascinating history which invites you to delve into its past. Its medieval origins lie in iron smelting and the related industry of charcoal burning, as evidenced by Hammer Ponds at Shottermill.

The National Trust (one of whose founders lived in the town) owns much of what remains of the abundant forest and also nearby Black Down, Marley Common, and the Devil's Punch Bowl at Hindhead.

Haslemere's many shops, restaurants and cafés add to the town's vibrant atmosphere. refurbished and long-renowned museum has many fascinating exhibitions, while Haslemere Hall is the centre of cultural life with a wide variety of



shows, opera productions, plays, films and other events. It is no surprise that Haslemere a popular place in which to live and work.

Haslemere is easily accessible from most major airports and ferry ports. It has good road links to the south coast, London and beyond. Haslemere is on the main railway line from London Waterloo to Portsmouth.

Haslemere, with its wide range of good accommodation, makes a delightful and convenient centre for visiting the many attractions and places of interest which are within easy reach.

The War Memorial, situated prominently in Haslemere High Street, is a listed monument. It is dedicated to 109 local heroes (108 men

and one woman), 62 of whom gave their lives during World War I and 47 during World War II. The full story of their heroism is told on the webthat volunteers have developed www.haslemere.com/warmemorial.

The memorial is unusual in that, for World War 1, it records the name of the casualty and place of death. It is made of brittle sandstone and was restored in the winter of 2006-7, returning the cross to its original height.

Haslemere Hall was built in 1913 by Lewis Barclay Day and designed by Annesley Brownrigg. The Hall, with its convivial atmosphere, is used by local people and visitors to the town as a cinema

with the latest films. a theatre for Opera Haslemere South, Players, Haslemere Thespians, dramatic societies and for musical events. It is the home of the Haslemere Music and

Arts Festival which has developed from the original Festival of Early Music initiated by the Dolmetsch family of musicians and instrument makers.

Haslemere Educational Museum, founded in 1888, provides educational opportunities for local people and visitors. It contains wonderful collections featuring geology, botany, zoology, archaeology and social history. Please see page 20 for more information.

### **OUT AND ABOUT**

#### Lynchmere, Hammer and Camelsdale

The parish of Lynchmere includes the villages of Hammer and Camelsdale. It is the most northern parish in the district of Chichester, bordered on the north by the River Wey (which divides West Sussex from Surrey). Lynchmere began as a Saxon settlement with evidence of these origins in the church of St. Peter. During the reign of King John,

Shulbrede Priory was founded in 1190 and was dedicated to St. Mary, the Holy Cross and St. Eustace. It is now a private house which can be visited on the May and

August bank holidays. Hammer played an important role in the early iron smelting industry and takes its name from the 'Hammer' Pond. A community developed around the brickworks in the 19th century when Camelsdale also blossomed.



Grayswood

**Grayswood** is a picturesque village two miles north east of Haslemere on the A286, a former turnpike road. The parish was created in 1902 from parts of Haslemere, Chiddingfold, Witley and Thursley. Thought of as a "working village" by those who live there, Grayswood boasts many amenities, including a school, pub, church, village hall and a village green with many cricket teams. All Saints Church was completed in 1902 to the design of Axel Haig, a leading figure in the Victorian Gothic revival. Haig lived in Grayswood from 1891 until he died in 1921 and the Gothic style of All Saints reflects that of the many medieval churches found in his Swedish homeland. His gravestone, in front of the lower tower, is in the shape of an ancient Viking rune stone.

The Grayswood Cricket Club is a great success and the lovingly nurtured pitches can be found in the centre of the village green. In the 1990s the green could have been mistaken for an unkempt pasture, but it has since been transformed into one of the county's most successful cricket venues.

Within strolling distance of the green is The Wheatsheaf, a splendid Real Ale pub with an excellent restaurant. In the summer it is all but buried beneath a mountain of flowers.

Across the road is the Grayswood Village Club, formerly the Working Man's Club and before that the village school. It also doubles up as the cricket club rendezvous and has a collection of sepia photographs of Victorian Grayswood. The present Church of England Infant School, opened in 1905, is now tucked into the corner of the village green, almost hidden by two glorious oak trees.

The village hall is a relatively new one, thanks in part to Lottery funding. It is a splendid building, designed by a local architect, and has many uses, including as a crèche and venue for parties.

Hindhead lies to the north of Haslemere and developed along the A3 London to Portsmouth road at its crossing with the A287 Farnham to Midhurst road. It was the haunt of highwaymen who found rich pickings from those travelling by stage coach from London to Portsmouth.

The area is a major attraction for walkers and sightseers who are able to enjoy the peace of the heath and woodland. Visitors to Gibbet Hill can enjoy magnificent views over the Surrey and Sussex Weald and towards London from the second highest vantage point in Surrey.

Volunteering holidays can be taken by arrangement with The National Trust for their Hindhead Youth Hostel, also Hunter Base Camp in Haslemere. They also have a café at the Devil's Punch Bowl.

The character and attractiveness of Hindhead will be enhanced when the current A3 is redirected through the Hindhead Tunnel, scheduled for completion in 2011.

The **Devil's Punch Bowl** is a large heather-filled basin formed naturally by the action of many springs where the Hythe Beds of Greensand meet Atherfield Clay. It is designated as a Site of Special

Scientific Interest (SSSI) because it contains Lowland Heathland. manmade environment, which is rarer than the Amazonian Rainforest. It dates from the Bronze Age and is the intermediate stage

in an ecological succession from bare ground to woodland.

The National Trust is removing birch and pine from this woodland to facilitate grazing and encourage the heathland to return, thus conserving wildlife. There are rare bird species such as the Dartford Warbler, Nightjar and Woodlark. Also seen are the Silver Studded Blue Butterfly, Sand Lizard and Adder.

The valley of the Devil's Punch Bowl contains several small 18th century cottages once occupied by people known as 'broom squires' who made besom brooms from heather and birch - many for use at Windsor Castle and Hampton Court.

Hindhead Commons were acquired by the Haslemere Commons and Footpath Preservation

Society in 1905 from the Lord of the Manor of Witley. In 1906 the land was transferred to The National Trust. There are over 570 hectares (1400 acres) of attractive heath and woodland. In the late 19th century Hindhead Commons was described as 'the fashionable capital of the beautiful Surrey Highlands' and `Little Switzerland'. Local folklore

links the area with the Devil. Gibbet Hill and the Sailor's Stone recount a murder in 1786 when highwaymen regularly attacked coaches travelling between London and Portsmouth.

The Sailor's story. On Hindhead Commons there is a vivid reminder of the events of 24th September 1786 when an unknown sailor,

travelling the old Portsmouth Road, was murdered by three assailants. Two new information boards relate the story and decode the enigmatic Celtic cross. The boards were unveiled by the Haslemere Initiative on the 221st anniversary of the sailor's death.

Sponsors of the work included the Three Counties Association of National Trust Members and the Ordnance Survey. A remnant of the gibbet may be seen in the Haslemere Educational Museum.

The Gibbet and Celtic Cross. Criminals were hanged on the gibbet and their tarred bodies left

to swing in clanking irons until they rotted. This area had a reputation for being haunted so, in 1851, Sir William Erle of Bramshott Grange had a granite Celtic cross erected near the site to try to dispel the fears of local residents. Around the base of the cross are four Latin inscriptions.

Beacon Hill has a number of shops and restaurants. The village grew rapidly from nothing to become a residential area in the 1880s. This thriving community has no known ancient history. The parish church of St. Alban's was constructed in 1906 to designs by Coleridge.

There are many places in this country with the name Beacon Hill. The firing of beacons kept on prominent hill tops was an integral part of the British defence system for many years. The last chain of beacons was lit on 2nd June 1977 to commemorate the Queen's Silver Jubilee.

Grayshott lies south-west of Hindhead and alongside the A3 London to Portsmouth road. It has twice been voted the best village in Hampshire and also the best in the South of England for Business in the Community. The village takes great pride in its success at blending the modern and the traditional, the popular and the eclectic, as well as the residential and business communities. Grayshott has a number of fine specialist shops and restaurants.

The renowned Grayshott Pottery attracts many visitors who can watch the art pottery-making. The Gravshott name is famous worldwide for its stoneware and

porcelain - a complete picture is available on www.grayshott.com.

The modern day village of Grayshott was originally open wasteland of pine, heather and gorse, so it is easy to see why it developed so late. The high land near Hindhead was known for its remoteness. poorness of soil and its reputation for lawlessness. The name of Grayshott can be found as far back as the 12th century and, along with other nearby villages, was considered to have special health qualities.

A public house appeared in Grayshott before either a permanent church or a village hall. The Fox and Pelican was formally opened on 23rd August 1899 by Mrs Randall Davidson, wife of the Bishop of Winchester.

The pub is outdated by Grayshott Village School which was opened on 4th September 1871 with seven children attending, a figure which has grown to over 200.

Thursley is a small Surrey village which lies west of the A3, between Milford and Hindhead. The name came from the god Thor and was probably a site where he was worshipped. Thursley is known for its Common, a National Nature Reserve, which is a surviving area of lowland peat bog providing a rich habitat for dragonflies, damselflies, the

endangered Woodlark and Dartford Warbler. Thursley Military Camp (renamed Tweedsmuir) housed British, American and Canadian forces

during World War II and was bombed in 1942 - it later Polish housed Nearby refugees. Houndown Camp was used by the British Royal Marines.

St. Michael & All

Angels Church is mentioned in the Domesday Book but the earliest features of the existing building date from 1100. The famous murdered sailor's tomb is among several 18th and 19th century monuments in the churchyard.

Thursley Cricket Club was established in 1860 with teams playing every weekend during the season on the cricket ground.

Thursley Village Hall, built in the 19th century as the village school, has been completely refurbished for uses ranging from committee meetings to wedding receptions.

The Three Horseshoes pub dates from the 17th century and caters for everyone.

**Chiddingfold** is an attractive village steeped in history, having been famous throughout Europe

for the glass made between the 13th and 17th centuries. This glass adorns the windows Westminster Abbey and St. George's Chapel, Windsor. There is a local butcher established

for more than 290 years and the Swan Inn attracts people from far and wide.

Fernhurst is an attractive village overlooked by It has a lovely village green Black Down. surrounded by beautiful, old buildings. Formally known as 'Farnhurst', the village's history originates from the hunter gatherers who settled there during the Stone Age. The Romans and Saxons built more buildings in the area, including the Saxon church at nearby Selham.

Liphook grew from the hamlet of Bramshott and was known during the 15th century as Chiltlee or Chiltley. This small hamlet in the Middle Ages, expanded to become an important stop-off point for the stage coaches travelling between London and Portsmouth. In 1916 Flora Thompson moved to Liphook and became famous as the author of "Lark Rise to Candleford".

During both the First and Second World Wars, Liphook was used as a base for many Canadian

troops and consequently a number of modern roads have Canadian place names. An avenue of 209 Maple

trees was planted along the A3, with a single tree for every two servicemen buried in the nearby Bramshott and Brookwood cemeteries. Liphook is the home of Hollycombe, a delightful collection of steam-powered attractions.

#### Frensham Common and Frensham Ponds

This area of 1000 acres of attractive countryside lies to the north-west of Haslemere on both sides of the A287 and is of historic and ecological interest. The common contains heathland, mixed

woodland and two large ponds known as Frensham Great and Little Ponds which were dug in the Middle Ages to provide fish for the Bishop of Winchester's estate. There are four Bronze Age burial

mounds on top of the ridge between the two ponds. There are miles of footpaths and bridleways with a number of marked walks and cycle trails. Sailing and angling are available for club members. The site supports many birds and all six native British reptiles. It is designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) in recognition of being an internationally important heathland habitat.

**Tilford** is a picturesque village lying on the River Wey between the A287 and B3001. Nearby is the great Cistercian Abbey of Waverley founded in 1128. Two medieval bridges span the branches of the river and are listed as ancient monuments.

Several substantial farm houses date from the 16<sup>th</sup>Tilford century. House was built in 1727 and its chapel in 1776. The village long green has associations with cricket. It is the heart

of village life with its pub and nearby Rural Life Centre. The Tilford Institute, built in 1894 to Sir Edwin Lutyens' design is a focus for social and sports activities.

### OUT AND ABOUT

**Lurgashall** dates back to Saxon times. It means literally 'aula' (hall) of Leotegar who came to Wealden forest in AD 495. Few of these historical roots remain, but St. Laurence's Church retains some of its original Saxon structure alongside more modern features such as the Millennium Window over the West door, depicting various scenes of village life both past and present.

Originally a thriving village, Lurgashall had all but disappeared by the end of the  $11^{\rm th}$  century and therefore has no mention in the Domesday Book. The area known as Park Farm originates from a Norman manor house built there in 1100, in time to rejuvenate the area.

The popular Noah's Ark pub is thought to originate from an older construction, that of the village inn built at the side of the Green in 1557. It is believed the unusual name comes from a pond in front of the door which patrons crossed to enter, making them look like animals boarding the ark.

**Lodsworth** is a parish, south-east of Haslemere, famous for the production of cider from its apple and cherry orchards, and for making bricks from the Weald Clay. St. Peter's Church, built around 1230, possesses the oldest silver chalice in the Midhurst Deanery, the Lodsworth Cup, dating from 1567. Lodsworth was famous for its quern stones quarry when Lodsworth rock was used to grind corn to flour. The local public house, The Hollist Arms, dates from the 15<sup>th</sup> century when it was known as the Crown Mants, subsequently Poyntz Arms (the general court baron was W.S. Poyntz), until Hasler Hollist, a local dignitary, took over in 1838.

**Midhurst** is a market town eight miles south of Haslemere on the A286 with good bus links. The cathedral city of Chichester is less than 15 miles beyond. Midhurst has many interesting features including one of the oldest pubs in Sussex, The Swan Inn, Market Square. Cowdray House, dating from Tudor times, had remained a ruin from 1793, following a savage fire, until 2007 when it reopened again. Part of the splendour of Cowdray House lies in the symmetry of the courtyard plan

but the Great Hall range is still medieval in character with large Gothic windows and the entrance porch at the lower end. For full details please see www.cowdray.org.uk

and www.walledgardencowdray.co.uk.

Beautiful rural countryside and wooded hills surround the town.

**Kirdford**. Dating from the Bronze Age and the largest of the West Sussex parishes, Kirdford covers an area of 14 square miles. Although many industries have flourished over the years, Kirdford is probably best known for its fruit growing and glass working. The latter of these prosperous industries dates from the medieval period and was prevalent for over 200 years. We know that glass was made in the woods around the parish as fragments have been found and used to glaze the lancet window in the north wall of St. John the Baptist Church.

Fruit growing has always been a popular industry in Kirdford and apples in particular have been grown on a large scale for hundreds of years. Even to the present day, over 20 varieties of apples and pears are grown on fruit farms in the area and cider was produced on a large scale from the 13th through to the 19th century.

Kirdford boasts two picturesque public houses, both with excellent reputations. The Half Moon pub, found opposite the church, was originally a row of cottages once used as workshops for craftsmen and dating from 1640. The Foresters Arms can be found just around the corner and dates from the 17th century.

A scheme of 20 eco-friendly homes including low energy lighting and recycling facilities has been built in Bourn Meadows. It is a modern version of the village green that has long been an essential part of the rural British landscape.

**Petworth** an old market town, is an ideal place to stroll through narrow streets, alleyways and pretty cobbled squares, with fine shops and restaurants.

There are antiques centres and i n d i v i d u a l antiques shops. The National Trust owns Petworth House and the fabulous grounds of Petworth Park. Visitors can view the magnificent art collection

which includes works of Turner, Van Dyck, Gainsborough, Bosch, Reynolds and William Blake. The 700 acre park was landscaped by 'Capability' Brown and is open to the public all year round. The house is the home of Lord and Lady Egremont.



#### **LEISURE**

Visitors and local people are spoilt for choice as the Haslemere area has wonderful and diverse countryside for all leisure and sporting pursuits.

The National Trust has owned much of the beautiful countryside surrounding Haslemere and Hindhead since 1905, so ensuring its protection from development. Sir Robert Hunter, one of the three founders of The National Trust, lived in Haslemere from 1883 until he died in 1913. He was Chairman and its legal expert for 18 years from 1895, and drew up the constitutional documents for the 1907 National Trust Act.

Haslemere is a gateway town to Surrey Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB), which was designated in 1958 and has a diverse and rich landscape waiting to be discovered. Surrey Hills extend across the chalk North Downs running from Farnham in the west, above Guildford, Dorking and Reigate, to Oxted in the east. The Greensand Hills in the south include Black Down and the Devil's Punch Bowl, to Leith Hill in the east, with the river valleys of the Wey, Tillingbourne and Mole in between.

WALKING is a favourite pastime in Haslemere and Hindhead as the area is surrounded by beautiful countryside, wooded hills, heathland and valleys. There is an extensive footpath network, open commons with breathtaking views, attractive market towns and villages. Haslemere enjoys many local walks and is easily accessible by South West Trains from most stations between London Waterloo and Portsmouth.

The Haslemere Visitor & Local Information Centre has a selection of free walks leaflets. Please visit www.haslemere.com/vic/walks

The Town Trail commences at Haslemere Educational Museum in the High Street and takes you through the historical market town. Swan Barn Farm is a nearby short walk, and Black Down and Devil's Punch Bowl are picturesque walking areas around Haslemere.

You can also enjoy one of six Rail to Ramble walking routes. These interlinking routes extend from 4 miles (2.4 kilometres) to 12 miles (7.5 kilometres) and begin and end at a railway station. Rail to Ramble packs are inexpensive and can be ordered online at www.surreyhills.org or follow one of the walking routes such as Frensham, Churt or Tilford. Free leaflets are available via www.surreyhills.org or download a route description and map.

The Greensand Way from Haslemere can be extended into a longer walk continuing to Ham Street, Ashford, Kent. www.nationaltrails.gov.uk



CYCLING is a favourite pastime for visitors and residents. Haslemere provides a wonderful starting point to see the beautiful and diverse countryside. The Surrey Cycleway is a signposted on-road leisure route around the south of Surrey and includes links with Haslemere, Cranleigh, Farnham, Woking, Egham and Leith Hill, the highest point in southern England. www.surreycc.gov.uk

#### RIDING

There are a variety of trails for all riders with something to suit everyone and their horses, whatever their experience or needs.

Rights of Way networks offer both on and off road hacking with waymarked circular routes, horse box parking and horse friendly pubs on the way.

The South Downs Way and The Ridgeway are excellent for a trekking holiday - long distance trails through beautiful countryside with friendly B&Bs providing accommodation at the end of the day.

There are many local stables offering organised trips with other riders and experienced horses.



This fascinating museum was founded in 1888 by the renowned surgeon Sir Jonathan Hutchinson. It contained his extensive life long collection of objects of interest in the fields of geology, botany, zoology, archaeology and social history.

Determined to offer educational opportunities to local people, he opened his museum to the public. Its growth and popularity led to the launch of an innovative series of lectures and activities, a tradition that continues today. Visit the museum and pick up our exciting programme of events and exhibitions. The splendidly refurbished and newly designed galleries, that fully re-opened in 2003, display a variety of remarkable and rare collections. Magnificent specimens from the animal kingdom, fossils and plants, also artefacts from Ancient Civilizations and Stone Age Britain, are exhibited with old favourites such as Arthur the Bear. Then walk inside a darkened enclosure and look closely at the Egyptian Mummy.

Out in the grounds there is an observation beehive, awardwinning herb garden and a pond used for pond dipping. In the woodland there is a gazebo with extensive views towards Lythe Hill. The historic layout also contains a curved ha-ha and some unusual trees and shrubs.

The Rural Life Centre is a museum of past village life covering the years from 1750 to 1960.

It is set in over ten acres of garden and woodland and housed in purpose-built and reconstructed buildings including a chapel, village hall, cricket pavilion and schoolroom.

St. Bartholomew's Church plays a central role in the life and community of Haslemere, having strong links with the civic life of the town and committed to education through St. Bartholomew's C of E aided school. Originally St. Bartholomew's was the daughter church of Chiddingfold until she became a parish in her own right. The building is of early English style and mostly built in 1871 on the site of an earlier church. The tower is probably 13th century with a Gothic-style top added at a later date under a pyramidal roof. Features include a Tennyson memorial window designed by Burne-Jones and another one commemorating Gerard Manley Hopkins. Also to be seen is an

illuminated manuscript commemorating the memory of Sir Norman Angell, whose inspiration led to the formation of the League of Nations. The 250 modern hand embroidered kneelers are well worth a visit as is the newly renovated St. Cecilia Screen originally designed by Ann Macbeth and made in Haslemere in 1905. The church is usually open daily from 9.00am - 4.00pm.

St. Christopher's Church is a pretty Arts and Crafts listed church which celebrated its centenary in 2004. Designed by Charles Spooner, a disciple of William Morris, and built of local Bargate stone, it stands on St. Christopher's Green at the Wey Hill end of town. Almost all of the interior furnishings were designed by the architect, which makes for a very pleasing sense of unity. Amongst its treasures is the Pre-Raphaelite altar-piece by Spooner's wife Minnie Dibden-Spooner. Church office - 01428 644578. Rector: Revd Norman Jones.

#### Shopping in Haslemere

Haslemere as a shopping destination has maintained its traditional character and sense of individuality in the face of the increased 'cloning' of town centres elsewhere.

Two-thirds of the shops in and around Haslemere are independently owned, some of which have been run by two or more generations of the same family, giving the town a friendly, community atmosphere and making shopping a genuinely unique experience. It is particularly well-endowed with shops selling clothes and other fashion items, most of which are independent businesses, but it also supports independent florists, bookshops, sports shops and pet shops.

If you feel like being pampered there are several places from which to choose and if you are looking for furniture, flooring or interior design these are catered for too.

Although the march of the supermarkets has led to a reduction in high street butchers, bakers, greengrocers and delicatessens, Haslemere and its surrounding villages still have a selection from which to choose, each with a mouth-watering array of unusual and high quality food.

During recent years the town has hosted a Christmas market on the first Sunday of December but more recently, as the popularity of locally produced foods continues to grow, it has reintroduced a traditional farmers' market, which takes place on the first Sunday of each month.
