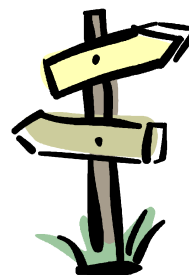

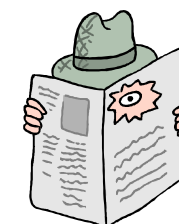

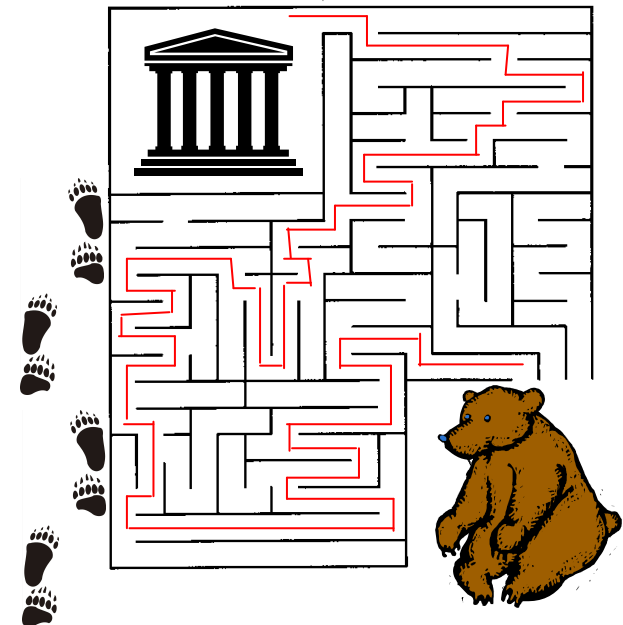
### Did you know...?
